Royal Caribbean has made the decision to delay their arrival back to Baltimore from Sunday at 7 am to Monday at 7 am. This will allow Port operations personnel additional time for snow removing duties. The ship is returning from an eight-day cruise to the Bahamas. It will head out Monday night for a nine-day cruise to the Caribbean

The Port of Baltimore's public marine terminals will close this evening at 7 pm and remain closed through Sunday.

The Maryland Port Administration has already mobilized snow team personnel who will work 12-hour shifts beginning Friday night and operate snow removal equipment for the plowing and salting of the marine terminals

The safety of the men and women who work at the Port of Baltimore is paramount.

Due to the impending winter storm, the Port of Baltimore's public marine terminals will close this evening at 7 pm and remain closed through Sunday. If the storm is less impactful than is predicted, this decision may be reevaluated.

Royal Caribbean is expected to make a decision today on the status of the Grandeur of the Seas cruise ship. The ship is returning to the Port of Baltimore on Sunday morning from a cruise and is scheduled to depart Sunday evening on another cruise.

The safety of the men and women who work at the Port of Baltimore is our top priority. We have already mobilized snow team personnel who will work 12-hour shifts beginning Friday night and prepared snow removal equipment for the plowing and salting of the marine terminals.

We will continue to keep you updated throughout this storm event on any changes to general Port of Baltimore public marine terminal operations through this e-broadcast messaging.
